Why Are We Doing This?



- Important economic driver
- Best agriculture land on Vancouver Island
- Decline in our ability to provide food for the local population
- Support- Cowichan Food Charter signed by Economic Development Commission, CVRD Board





Why Are We Doing This?



- 18% of our food comes from local sources generating \$47.5 million in gross receipts.
- Provides rural lifestyle

- Most of 2009 spent on developing the plan



Area Agriculture Action Plan



Vision



To develop a thriving and diverse agricultural industry in the Cowichan Region which:

- Provides a healthy, high quality diet for the people who live and visit, and
- Preserves or enhances the character, environment and quality of life of the community.





Strategic Direction



Based on the consultation process, two key strategic directions will lead the industry towards its vision:

- Economic Development
- Food Security and Food Self-Sufficiency



Action Plan



The Action Plan identified 78 recommendations

Four Broad Areas:

- Plan Implementation Structure and Communication
- Policy, Land Use and Environment
- Attraction and Marketing
- Education



Action Plan Goals



- Communication network between agriculture and the community- 15 action items
- Government policy framework- 45 action items
- Access to markets- 10 action items
- Preservation of environment- 8 action items



Water



- 32,830 hectares of arable land
- 9421 hectares are considered prime agricultural land
- However, 80% of this area requires irrigation to produce high value crops
- Only 2,465 hectares are currently irrigated

Water Action Items



Increase Access to Water for Irrigation

- Initiate discussions with Catalyst
- Allow farmers access to Municipal water
- Develop strategies to reallocate water within current infrastructure
- Revisit Cowichan Basin Water Management Plan
- Explore potential water storage options
- Provide support for irrigation improvements
- Encourage Environmental Farm Plans



Water Action Items



Improve Water use Efficiency

 Hold a workshop that deals with water, irrigation design and water use efficiency

Improve Drainage

- Provide support to farmers to develop water management systems
- Assist with creation of Improvement Districts to coordinate maintenance of drainage channels

Water Action Items



Develop and maintain water control systems in low-lying areas



Area Agriculture Steering Committee Request- May 4, 2010



Request that the Electoral Area Services Committee recommend that the Cowichan Valley Regional District Board establish an Agricultural Advisory Committee comprised of government, community, farmers and other stakeholders to address the issues and actions identified in the Area Agriculture Plan.
